The ABCs of Law

Deacons, a Hong Kong law firm with more than 165 years of history, continues to work closely with the Hans Andersen Club. The two organisations have now worked together since 2014, creating an education programme specially designed to help children to develop their knowledge of the legal system in Hong Kong, including some basic legal concepts such as contractual obligations, intellectual property rights, and to understand their rights and obligations as members of Hong Kong's community.

"The ABCs of Law" is an initiative of Deacons' corporate social responsibility programme, "Deacons Cares". As part of the programme, Deacons' volunteers lead interactive workshops, either at the Hans Andersen centres or Deacons' offices. Through drama, stories, interactive discussions and special learning kits, children are encouraged to participate and express their views. What is "intellectual property"?

Intellectual property is a type of intangible property protected by law which generally includes, but is not limited to, patents, copyright, trademarks and designs.

Why do we have to protect intellectual property? The reason is that we have to respect the results of everyone's skills and labour! In fact, intellectual property protection can foster more creativity and enable people to make good use of their knowledge to create new things, so as to enhance societal progress and development. Original songs and lyrics are works which are protected by copyright. A copyright owner can reproduce, publicly perform and create adaptations of his/her own works.

If anyone uses any copyright works without the owner's authorization, such as copying songs, lyrics and other works created by others, he/she may have to bear legal liability.
